A successful missions trip will inspire and impact your church! Whether your group serves outside of the country or just down the street, your preparation (or lack of) can have a big impact on your overall effectiveness. The information in this process will provide much of the needed preparation.

READY

Agenda Item #1...Where are we going? With so many worthy projects inside and outside of our country, how do we settle on a mission's trip that is right for our church and our team? Your answer will be found through prayer and intentional research. There are several other factors to consider which includes cost, length of trip, suitable dates for team members and availability of the missionaries who will host your team. Don't rush the process. In time, you will settle on the project that is right for your team.

Now let's talk about the goal of your trip. Why are you going? Do you want to feed the poor? Do you want to build a church in a poverty-stricken village? Do you want to provide aide to the sick? Do you want to share your faith in Christ through your presence, deeds, and testimonies? Another option could be discipleship. The directive of this is to see a community in action; to deepen commitment to Christ; to teach servant hood; to see a global vision of God and the Kingdom. It could be a mixture of more than one but you've got to know our purpose.

PACK

Quick questions to ask as you are packing... Is there a dress code? Is there electricity? What is the climate like? Do I need electronics? Are electronics allowed? Is there anything I've packed that I'm not willing to lose? (If yes, leave it at home!) Do I have my bible? Do I have a reusable water bottle? What is the airlines weight limit for my luggage? How many pieces of luggage am I allowed to take? Have you included your prescription medicines? Do you have some of your favorite snacks? And we are just getting started! Look through your Pre-Departure Guide for a more exhaustive list of items to pack.

GO

The command of the Great Commission is to GO! There are millions of people who are in need and believing for the arrival of those who can help. Through our God given provisions we can help answer to their prayers. The amazing and unexpected reality is that we are the ones who return whom feeling blessed and inspired. Get ready...It's GO time!

GO MISSIONS PRE-PLANNING

Your missions trip will prove to be one of the most inspirational events you will do for the entire year. Prepare yourself because your team will come home spiritually pumped and ready to shake things up! Here is a basic outline to help you prepare for your trip.

10+ MONTHS BEFORE

- Schedule your initial planning meeting.
- Determine your trip destination.
- Have potential team members fill out their trip application.
- Have parents sign release forms for minors.
- Perform a cost analysis of the trip per team member.
- Create a time line of monies due for team members.
- Select a team coordinator to oversee the entire project.
- Decide your team purpose and what items you plan to give away.
- Empower a team to start soliciting give away items.
- Empower a team to start soliciting funds.
- Encourage team members to use a solicitation letter to raise funds for their trip.

8+ MONTHS BEFORE

- Schedule your second team meeting.
- Collect monies due by team members.
- Determine how many (if any) team fund raisers you want to have.
- Assign leaders to oversee various positions (if needed).
- Provide an update on items collected for giveaways.
- Talk about passport deadlines.

5+ MONTHS BEFORE

- Schedule your third team meeting.
- Collect monies due by team members.
- Determine how many (if any) team fund raisers you want to have.
- Assign leaders to oversee various positions (if needed).
- Provide an update on items collected for giveaways.
- Talk about passport deadlines.
- Recruit someone to develop a t-shirt design for the trip.
- Collaborate with host missionary to determine your trip itinerary.

3+ MONTHS BEFORE

- Collect monies due by team members.
- Discuss final fund raisers.
- Determine what your fund raiser monies will be used for.
- Collect personal information for each team member for purchase of airfare.
- Ensure the host missionary has finalized your ministry itinerary.
- Discuss final give away items to be collected.
- Obtain t-shirt sizes for every team member.
- Order t-shirts.
- Have passports in hand.

2+ MONTHS BEFORE

- Purchase airfare.
- Purchase or collect donated luggage for giveaways.
- Collect final items to give away.
- Schedule packing night for giveaway items and weigh every bag (Check airline for maximum weight of luggage).
- Collect final payment from every team member.

1 - 2 WEEKS BEFORE

- Host final meeting.
- Give everybody their t-shirts and ask them to wear them to the airport.
- Provide every team member with a digital copy of your Pre-Departure Guide.
- Finalize responsibilities of all team members.
- Determine a place and time to meet the morning of departure.
- Provide matching luggage tags for all team members for easy identification at the destination airport.

DAY OF DEPARTURE

- Get to the airport on time!
- Ensure you have your personal items and your passport!
- Check in with your event coordinator.
- Take needed checks/cash with you.
- Have a great time and do your best to represent our Lord Jesus Christ.

I, _____, RECOGNIZE AND ACCEPT THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS WHICH WILL FURTHER THE EFFECTIVENESS, USEFULNESS, AND SAFETY OF OUR SHORT-TERM VOLUNTEER PROJECT. IF ACCEPTED AS A MEMBER OF THIS MISSIONS TEAM, I AGREE TO:

1. **Release and discharge** the organizations and individuals which helped make these arrangements, including AOCLI, or any other sponsoring agencies, their agents, employees, officers, and volunteers, from all claims, demands, actions, judgments, or executions that I have ever had, or now have, or may have, or which my heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns may have or claim to have, against these organizations, their agents, for all personal injuries, known or unknown, and injuries to property, real or personal, caused by, or arising out of this journey. I intend to be legally bound by this statement.
2. **AOCLI and its representative(s)** with me on any such trip authority to request and authorize medical and/or hospital treatment for my benefit in the event of any injury or sickness sustained by me while on such trip, including, without limitation, while traveling to and from any foreign country. I agree to pay for all such treatment and to reimburse AOCLI for all costs and expenses incurred by it with respect to such treatment.
3. **Adopt an attitude** that I am on this team to try to understand the host culture, not to convince them of my own viewpoint or style.
4. **Abstain from making** derogatory comments or arguments regarding people, politics, sports, religion, race, or traditions.
5. **Accept and submit** to the authority of the team leader and promise to abide by his or her decisions as they concern this humanitarian trip.
6. **Acknowledge that** by engaging in this journey, I am subjecting myself to certain risks voluntarily, including and in addition to those risks that I normally face in my personal and business life, including but not limited to such things as health hazards due to poor food and water, diseases, pests, and poor sanitation; potential danger

from lack of control over local population; potential injury while working; and inadequate medical facilities.

7. **Expeditiously meet** my financial obligation.
8. **If a loved one or dear friend** is traveling with me, we agree to interact with all members on the team, not just one another. I promise not to initiate or seek new romantic relationships with team members or indigenous people during this trip.
9. **Refrain from using** tobacco or alcoholic beverages while in the host country. Abstain from any illegal drugs or prohibited activity while on this trip.
10. **Refrain from giving gifts**, such as money, clothes, jewelry, tape players, etc. If I feel compelled to give a gift to someone I have met, I will consult first with the team leader before I promise or give the gift, and I promise to let him or her make the final decision on this matter.
11. **I agree that** in the event my conduct is considered so unsatisfactory that it jeopardizes the success of the trip, and that mediation during the trip has failed to correct my behavior, that my services in connection with this mission shall end and I shall return home immediately at my own expense.

A Comprehensive Meeting Guide

THE POWER OF PURPOSEFUL PREPARATION

Taking a short-term mission trip with a team isn't just about booking flights and packing bags—it's about building a unified force for Kingdom impact! The months leading up to your departure are crucial for transforming individual volunteers into a cohesive, Spirit-led team ready to change lives and be changed themselves.

Every meeting must have intention. Don't gather just to check a box—gather to build something extraordinary. Each session should leave your team more informed, more connected, and more excited about the adventure ahead.

YOUR INITIAL MEETING: IGNITING THE VISION

Purpose: Information saturation and vision casting

Goals to Achieve:

- Paint a vivid picture of your destination and the people you'll serve
- Introduce your host partners and their incredible work
- Clearly outline costs, dates, and trip logistics
- Define ministry opportunities and individual roles
